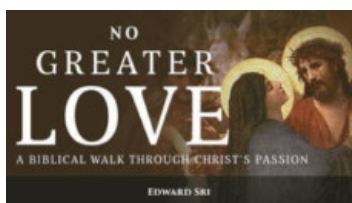

The Simple Act of Serving Others During Lent Can Change Your Life

Why on earth would I want to go to Haiti, possibly the poorest country in the southern hemisphere? It might be dangerous, given its history of deadly earthquakes, hurricanes and political upheaval.

Why? To do a new thing for others. Because my wife and I had been intrigued by parish events promoting our sister parish there and the great needs of the children and families.

As a result, in mid-2018 we joined the All Saints Haiti Committee in anticipation of possibly becoming part of the January 2019 trip. It was inspiring to meet fellow parishioners who had made multiple trips and to hear their stories about the friendly and always hopeful Haitians they had met and worked with, including many dedicated teachers.

When the deadline to sign up for the trip came, we committed and said yes. We responded to the opportunity to practice the tenets of our church mission - Love God, Serve Others, Form Disciples.

We made the trip in 2019 and it opened our eyes to the very real need to help educate the vulnerable children of Haiti. The way our parish does that is by raising funds to help pay the salaries of about 100 teachers in the 24 parish schools.

So, what was the new thing we did as a couple? All of it. Joining the Haiti Committee. Meeting a lot of wonderful people and making new

friends here and in Haiti. Raising funds. Making the trip in 2019. Committing to our parish tenets. And changing our lives.

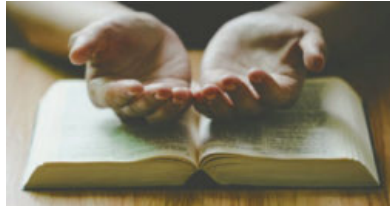

Transformation

God tells Israel through Isaiah, 'See, I am doing a new thing'. God tells the people of Israel all things He is doing for them because they have forgotten God. The readings for the Second week of Lent are about Transformation, God reminding us that He is here. The First reading is God transforming Abram, blessing Abram, directing Abram to go to a new place to become the Father of a 'great nation'. In the Second reading Paul tells us we are transformed through the Passion of Christ. In the Gospel we hear Matthew's account of the Transfiguration, Jesus in his glorious body a foreshadowing of Christ's Resurrection and Ascension. It would seem that God is showing us the new things he is doing by encouraging us towards transformation. It would seem that transformation is something important in Lent, maybe because we are leading up to Christ's suffering and death and Resurrection. It certainly would be important to remember what God has done for us through Christ's Life and Death and Resurrection. Maybe the call to Transformation is to make us more worthy of participation in the Resurrection? Usually in Lent I try to change a habit but, it is usually for only a few weeks and then I go back to normal. So, nothing really changes, there is no transformation, there is only a vague awareness of what God has done for me. I wonder if I am not thinking about Lent correctly. Maybe I should be considering how I can start a transformation and then how to make the transformation permanent? Maybe I should consider what is it that will bring me closer to God and more worthy of participation in the Resurrection? Maybe this year Lent can be as simple as finding ways to spend more time with God and not forgetting what He has done for me. Maybe Lent could be the doorway to God's presence this year.



Update on HyVee receipts

March 31 ends another years' collection of HyVee receipts. We will turn in receipts to HyVee and they will calculate this year's donation to All Saints School. That does NOT mean you should quit saving your receipts! Keep on saving them and turning them in! April 1 will start a new year of collection. A couple of reminders: (1). Only HyVee receipts from the Cedar Rapids area qualify which includes HyVee gas, and HyVee restaurant receipts. (2) Turn in receipts regularly either at the school or the church. Receipts less than 2 weeks old can be scanned for Box Top rewards which is also making money for the school; (3) Turn in the entire receipt as the bottom half has the date of purchase which is required to be eligible. You are Cordially Invited...



Welcome to the second Sunday of Lent. Today's Gospel reading in Matthew is an invitation that is extended to us at every Mass; the invitation to be a disciple of Jesus.

Teachers know that in every class there are a few students who just "get it" more than the rest. They are not necessarily the favorites nor the smartest, but they have a unique ability to comprehend what is taught and then translate that learning to those around them. These are the students who can raise the bar in the classroom, because they affect the entire classroom in a positive way. They transform others. So, I believe it was with Jesus. He is beginning his journey to the end of his earthly life via his death on the cross. Time is becoming a critical factor. He sees within Peter, James and John, not perfection, but the ability to illuminate and spread his teachings. Jesus invites Peter, James and John to be converted from his followers to his disciples. Wait. Aren't those basically the same? Potatoes; Patatoes? In the Transfiguration, Jesus reveals the difference.

Edward Sri, in his book [Into His Likeness](#), states that accepting the invitation to discipleship "represents a decisive turning point in a person's life - a major break from the past and a complete reordering of priorities, which will now be centered on the Person of Jesus Christ." Now hold on a minute. That sounds like a life for holy-holies and saints - God cannot be inviting me to that! But just like Peter, James and John, Jesus is inviting all of us to become his disciple. Sri continues, "This does not mean that we must give up all our hopes, dreams, possessions and enjoyments of this world. But we must put our relationship with Jesus above all these things." When Jesus is conversing with Moses and Elijah, God speaks to Peter, James and John. "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." Just like Jesus had said earlier in what we know as the Sermon on the Mount, he did not come to abolish the law, as represented by Moses and Elijah, but to fulfill it. Jesus transfigures the law into love of God, love of neighbor and love of self. Jesus, in his call to discipleship, invites us to focus more on our interior heart and relationship with him than the outward signs of Christianity. Sri states that these outward signs are all good in and of themselves - attending Mass, financial support for the parish, serving in ministries, etc.; "but inwardly, do we encounter [and/or allow ourselves to encounter] Our Lord Jesus Christ who is inviting us into a deeper relationship with him?"

So how do we do that? Pope Francis reveals the answer, "From the event of the Transfiguration I would like to take two significant elements that can be summed up in two words: ascent and descent. We all need to go apart, to ascend the mountain in a space of silence, to find ourselves and better perceive the voice of the Lord. This we do in prayer. But we cannot stay there! Encounter with God in prayer inspires us anew to "descend the mountain" and return to the plain where we meet many brothers weighed down by fatigue, sickness, injustice, ignorance, poverty both material and spiritual. To these brothers in difficulty, we are called to bear the fruit of that experience with God, by sharing the grace we have received. And this is curious. When we hear the Word of Jesus, when we listen to the Word of Jesus and carry it in our heart, this Word grows. Do you know how it grows? By giving it to the other! The Word of Christ grows in us when we proclaim it, when we give it to others! And this is what Christian life is. It is a mission for the whole Church, for all the baptized, for us all: listen to Jesus and offer him to others."

And so, I invite you to attend the weekend liturgy (and then the next and the next...) Immerse yourself in the Lenten journey this year. Attend Stations, daily Mass, devote 5 minutes each day to prayer. But don't keep this to yourself; descend the mountain and share this love with others. This Lent, let us come together to be healed, to be restored and to be transformed.

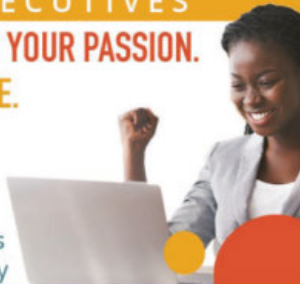
